in	Month <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He was born in July. Year <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He was born in 1992. Long periods <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He was born in the 90s. 	Enclosed area <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The shoes are in the box. City <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She lives in Miami. State <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She lives in Florida. Country <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She lives in the USA.
on	Day of the week <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The party is on Monday. Specific dates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The party is on October 31. • The party is on Halloween.
